1 p.m.

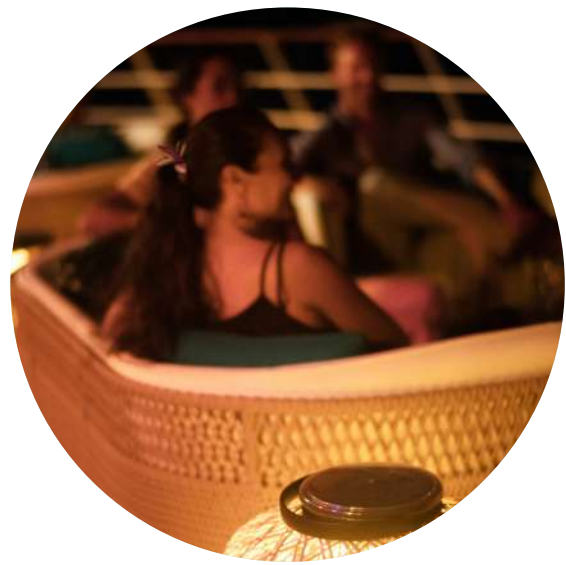

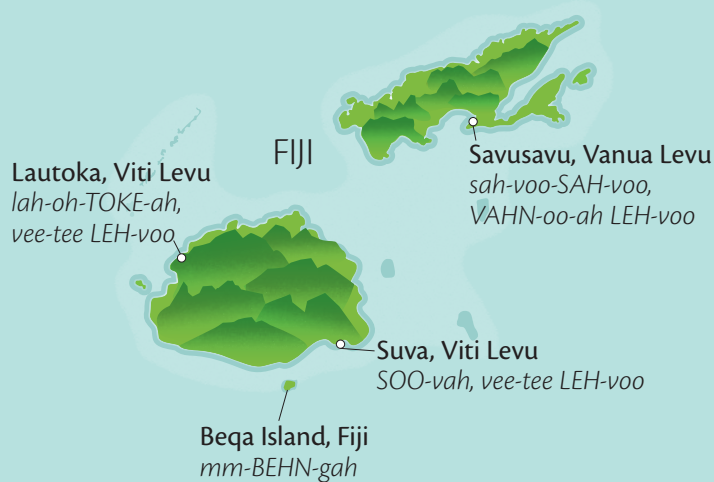
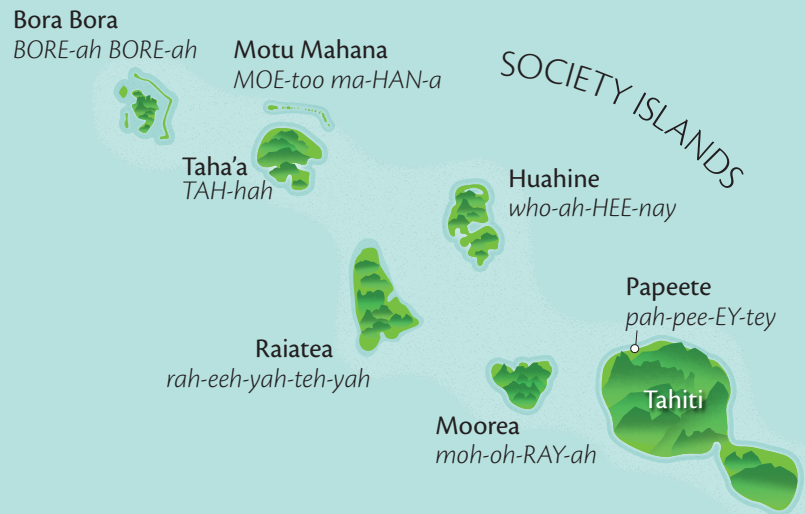
10 p.m.

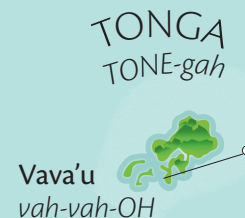
Your Destination Guide to Island Hopping in French Polynesia

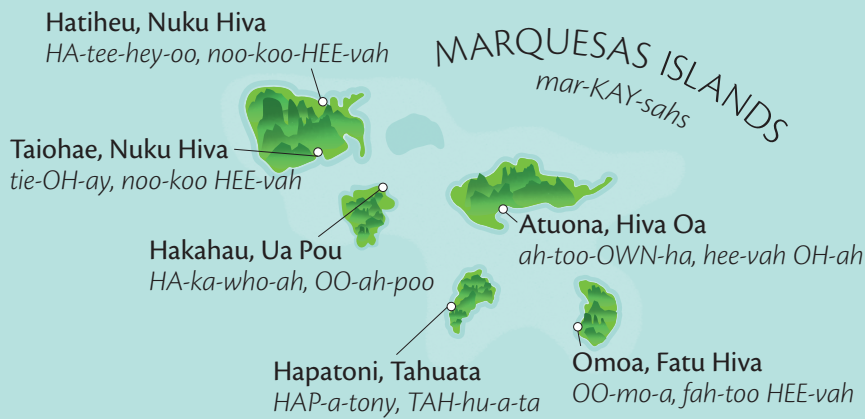
This is the French Polynesia of dreams—the one immortalized on vintage travel posters, stirring romantic wanderlust and fueling artistic expression. With warm hospitality, crystal-clear lagoons, endless blue skies, and majestic mountain peaks, the **SOCIETY ISLANDS** offer the perfect blend of serene beach relaxation and exhilarating adventures both underwater and on land.



The **ISLANDS OF FIJI** are legendary for their stunning scenery, pure-white sand beaches, and reef-rich waters so blue they seem to glow. Here guests can stroll palm-lined streets in Lautoka, snorkel coral blooms on Beqa Island, marvel at Suva's unique mix of modern and colonial style, and discover the South Seas of yester-year in Savusavu, called the "Hidden Paradise of Fiji."

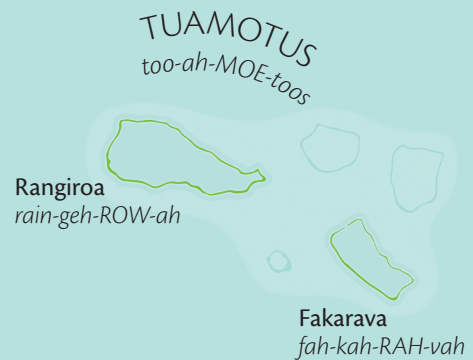
Farther west of the Cooks—and across the International Date Line—lies the **KINGDOM OF TONGA**, aka "The Friendly Isles." This tiny-but-mighty island nation is the only remaining monarchy in Polynesia. In the northern reaches of its 170 isles, Vava'u invites discovery of its culture and cuisine, hiking Mount Talau, and snorkeling in its crystalline lagoon.





In stark contrast to the low-lying Tuamotus, the UNESCO-listed **MARQUESAS** rise with towering volcanic peaks. The youngest of French Polynesia's islands, these lush, jungle-covered isles lack reefs and lagoons but are rich in ancient culture and myth. Long attracting artists and writers, the Marquesas are also the final resting place of poet Jacques Brel and painter Paul Gauguin.

East of the Society Islands lie the **TUAMOTUS**, the world's largest group of coral atolls and the lowest point in French Polynesia. These 75 "flat islands" contrast with their mountainous neighbors, but are a paradise for divers and snorkelers, home to vibrant reefs and marine life. An underwater camera is essential to capture the stunning Technicolor wonders beneath the surface.



The **COOK ISLANDS** are a pristine paradise free of branded resorts and buildings taller than coconut trees. The vibrant culture of the Cook Island *Maori* comes alive through music, storytelling, and dance, often welcoming you with the sounds of drums and ukuleles. With mountains rising over 2,000 feet above crystal-clear seas, guests will discover sugar-white sands, coral reefs, and untouched lagoons.

WHAT IS THE DEPOSIT POLICY?

A deposit of 25% of the fare is required within 72 hours of booking to confirm a reservation.

WHAT IS THE FINAL PAYMENT POLICY?

Unless otherwise noted, final payment must be received up to 90 days prior to date of travel. Final payment must be received within 48 hours of booking for bookings made 89 to 30 days prior to sailing. For reservations made 29 days or less prior to sailings; full and final payment will be due at the time of booking. The cruise line reserves the right to cancel any booking not fully paid at final payment due date. Payment may be made by bank wire, personal check, American Express, Visa or MasterCard. Once a deposit is made, all changes are subject to an administrative/cancellation fee. For more details, visit: www.pgcruises.com/legal-privacy.

WHAT IS THE CANCELLATION POLICY?

Deposited reservations that are canceled are subject to the following charges:

- Within 15 days of deposit: No fee*

- 365 days or more prior to departure date: *\$250 Administrative Fee per guest, can be applied to a future booking within 12 months of cancellation date
- 364 to 211 days prior to departure date: 10% of full fare, per guest, can be applied to a future booking within 12 months of cancellation
- 210 to 91 days prior to departure date: 25% of full fare, per guest
- 90 days or less prior to departure date: 100% of full fare, per guest

There is no grace period after 90 days. Bookings not paid in full at 90 days (or 30 days with prior policy) are subject to cancellation. Final payment must be received 90 days prior to voyage departure date. Cancellation terms apply to the cruise fare only. Payments can be transferred to an alternative booking up to 120 days of sailing. Airfare and pre/post hotel stays are subject to fees depending on the cancellation date. Airline tickets are issued 75 days prior to sailing. A cancellation penalty will apply to all airline tickets cancelled after issuance.

*Does not apply to bookings made within 90 days of sail date or that require full payment (whichever comes first).

CAN A DIRECT BOOKING BE TRANSFERRED TO A TRAVEL ADVISOR?

Bookings can only be transferred to a TA within 60 days of the original booking date. All transfer requests must be submitted in writing by the guest. This guideline applies only to bookings outside of 90 days prior to sailing.

The ships are not able to accommodate children under one year of age and reserve the right to restrict the number of those under three years of age on board. Babysitting services are not available. Parents must be diligent to guard their children while on or near the balconies or any railing. The ships are not equipped to provide pre-natal, post-natal or pediatric services.

WHAT IS THE DRESS CODE ON BOARD?

Country Club Casual, or elegant resort wear, is appropriate dress for all evenings aboard *The Gauguin*. Country Club Casual consists of a dress, or skirt or slacks with a blouse or sweater for ladies, and slacks and collared shirts for gentleman. No ties are required at any time, although gentlemen may opt to wear a jacket to the Captain's Welcome Reception. Please note that casual wear such as shorts, t-shirts, casual jeans (frayed and/or with holes), baseball caps, flip-flops, and Crocs are not considered appropriate after 6:00 p.m. in all restaurants and lounges. Bathrobes and bathing suits are not appropriate in the ship's restaurants and lounges, and shirts and shoes are required in all public areas at all times.

DO YOU ACCOMMODATE TRIPLES?

Yes, pricing for the third guest in the same stateroom is as follows: 17 years old and under sail FREE, 18 years of age and older 30% of adult fare. Paul Gauguin Cruises reserves the right to limit the number of single-occupancy cabins on any sailing. Third berth guests pay full air add-on.

WHAT IS THE SMOKING POLICY ONBOARD?

While smokers are given a warm welcome, we recognize the need to restrict where smoking is permitted so as not to cause discomfort to, or provide a health or safety hazard for, the majority of our guests who do not smoke.
